### **"Razbar", Iranian ensemble, Kurdish sacred music.**

Until recently, the venerable tradition of Kurdish sacred music was practically inaccessible for the uninitiated. Razbar, made up of eminent musicians, has decided to make this tradition known and thus to share their spiritual experiences. Their respect for the authentic form and spirit of this musical and liturgical tradition is more than just an aesthetic exercise. It is a real sharing of their sense of the sacred.

### **"Ensemble Diwan".**

A voyage into the heart of the rousing chants of the Isâwiyya Sufi Fraternity. This youthful group performs the repertoires of various Sufi masters. The mystical poems are chanted in rhythm with such traditional instruments as the bendir, the daff or the ghayta.

**RE-THINKING GLOBALIZATION.**

In Islam, human liberty is fundamental, since no clerical authority can interfere in the relationship between man and God; however, man must have the courage to live up to this freedom which, as it is often stated in the Koran, engages his personal responsibility. In this sense, spirituality is a privileged path to awakening. It creates an interior space in the

human consciousness, which allows the human being to have access to the only true form of liberation—that which delivers man from illusion and passion.
